






Boris Avrukh 1.d4 – King's Indian & Grünfeld

The most famous opening books from the last decade, Avrukh's 1.d4 repertoire, are being updated in four entirely reanalysed and rewritten new books. The third volume covers the King's Indian and Grünfeld.

Parimarjan Negi 1.e4 vs Minor Defences

Top Indian GM and celebrated theoretician Parimarjan Negi gives a super-ambitious repertoire for White starting with 1.e4. This fifth volume covers the Alekhine, Pirc, Scandinavian and other minor defences. The final volume on 1...e5 is in the works.

Michael Roiz The Nimzo-Indian

The Nimzo-Indian fulfils the dream of many players: a system against 1.d4 based on positional principles, leading to unbalanced positions and interesting games where you can outplay your opponent. Written by a top GM, this volume fills a vital gap in the Grandmaster Repertoire series.

Mihail Marin The Pirc Defence









Boris Gelfand Technical Decision Making in Chess





Opening Books




Nikolaos Ntirlis Playing 1.d4 d5

Nikolaos Ntirlis gives a complete repertoire for Black after 1.d4 d5, based on the Queen's Gambit Declined. Ntirlis is a Greek opening specialist and second for dozens of GMs as well as coach of the Danish national team.



Axel Smith e3 Poison

When Axel Smith was chasing his final GM norm, he decided he needed a change in his White opening repertoire. The result was a repertoire based on a set-up with the moves d4, \$\infty\$1f3, c4 and e3. It helped Axel Smith to the GM title, and led to the creation of e3 Poison.



John Shaw Playing 1.e4 – Sicilian & French

In this punchy repertoire with 1.e4, GM John Shaw supplies an ambitious and dynamic arsenal of ideas for White. The first volume covered the Caro-Kann, 1...e5 and various minor openings, and the repertoire is completed by this volume on the Sicilian and French.
